We are pleased to report a successful financial picture for 2010-2011. The generosity and faith of our partners in education and ministry propel St. Catherine’s to ‘light the way’ for future generations.

The 2010-2011 fiscal year brought many financial successes, which have allowed us to augment our school program. Most notably, increases in enrollment and financial contributions have allowed us to finish the year with a surplus while accomplishing \$400,000 in capital improvements and technology funding to enhance student learning and growth experiences.

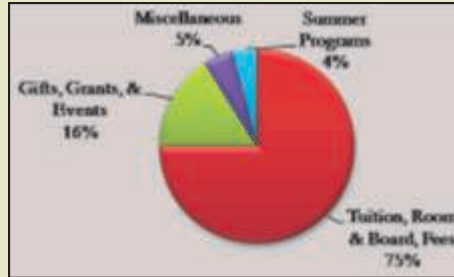

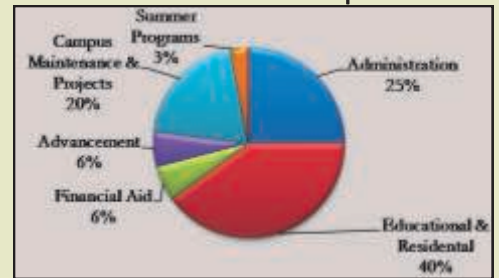

We are daily grateful to you for supporting the cadets of St. Catherine’s through your contributions, volunteer

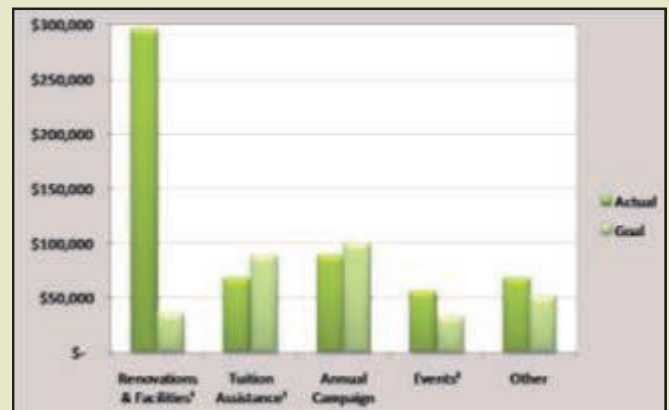

Strengthening our Dominican Identity

Parish school, orphanage, Catholic school with a **military tradition**. St. Catherine's has known many realities over the past 122 years, but we have always been Dominican. From Mother Pia in 1889 to our present-day sisters, the Dominican Sisters of Mission San Jose have maintained a constant presence—guiding and supporting our school. In 2010-2011, we worked to articulate and further incorporate the Dominican identity that has always been a part of St. Catherine's.

Over 800 years ago, Saint Dominic de Guzman founded the Dominican Order on the four pillars of community, ministry, study, and prayer. SCA has adopted these four pillars as the foundation for a St. Catherine's education. We have also chosen four Dominican saints to accompany us as we seek to live the four pillars in our daily lives: St. Dominic de Guzman (community), St.

Martin de Porres (ministry), St. Thomas Aquinas (study), and St. Catherine of Siena (prayer).



In the past year, we began to incorporate the pillars into the daily activities of the cadets and to build our educational program around them. In preparation for our WCEA/WASC accreditation that will take place in February 2012, we have re-written our mission statement, philosophy, and school-wide learning expectations to reflect the four pillars and our Dominican identity. Our cadets pray the Dominican Blessing each morning and ask for the prayers of Dominican saints and our own Mother Pia. Even our military guidons and cadence now incorporate the four pillars and their patron saints.

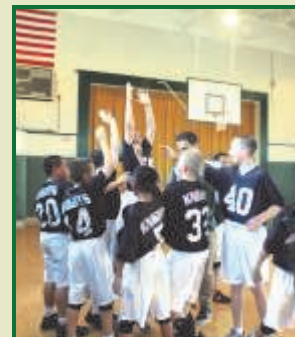

Improving Our Learning Environment

In 2010-2011, updating our school learning environment was a top priority. We are delighted to report that your generosity has allowed us to complete many renovations to our campus and update technology in the classroom in order to ensure that the cadets of St. Catherine's have a safe, comfortable, and up-to-date environment to learn, live, and play!

Work trucks and scaffolding were a common site on our campus throughout the year. To the right, you will see a timeline of our most significant projects. We are especially grateful to the J.F. Shea Foundation who provided a challenge grant of \$113,000 to replace our campus fence and repaint the entire school exterior. Our board of directors, parents, staff, and friends made this challenge grant possible by contributing over \$30,000 in less than a month. We are extremely grateful to everyone who played a role in these amazing renovations, which have truly been a "facelift" for our campus!

Another key step in improving our learning environment was the purchase of a travelling cart with 25 NetBook computers, which gives teachers and students the ability to use laptops in the classroom. Having completed this project in April, teachers immediately began using the cart to enhance their lessons through technology.

With a plant as large as SCA, smaller projects are also significant. The following projects were also completed during the last year:

- Renovation of the Sisters' kitchenette
- Update to SmartBoard systems in several classrooms
- Replacement of chapel vestments and liturgical items (Special thanks to Father Michael Pontarelli, OSM '69 and friends!)
- Installation of electronic reader board sign
- Purchase of energy-efficient tankless water heaters
- Placement of brick pavers and trees along campus edges
- Replacement of kitchen ovens and equipment

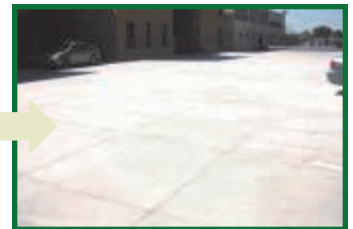


Timeline of Improvements



August 2010: Pool drainage system is replaced to conform to new California code.. Thanks to the DSMSJ for making this update possible!

August 2010: Thanks to the generosity of the Dan Murphy Foundation, the concrete white top is replaced due to excessive cracking.



December 2010: The entire school exterior is painted, thanks to the generosity of the J.F. Shea Foundation and our parents, staff, and friends who met the foundation's challenge of \$30,000.



January 2011: The J.F. Shea Foundation replaces our campus fence.

April 2011: A travelling NetBook cart with 25 computers is purchased to help teachers incorporate technology into their teaching methods more frequently.



July 2011: The staff prepares for the return of our students. Carpet is replaced in all classrooms, air conditioning units are repaired in the primary wing, the bathroom in the junior high building is renovated, and new couches are purchased for the dormitories.

Continuing the Tradition of Honor, Discipline, and Respect

The St. Catherine's military department is always looking forward and continually seeking new and innovative methods and techniques to motivate and teach our cadets the meaning of honor, discipline, and respect. Over the past year, we have maintained many of the traditions that have instilled these values for over 80 years while also updating our program to meet the needs of today's students.

A key change made during the 2010-2011 school year was the implementation of a new cadet honor code which uses positive language instead of negative language. The new honor code empowers each cadet to define himself by *what he does and how he treats others* rather than *what he does not do*.

A St. Catherine's cadet will

- tell the truth
- do his own work
- respect others' property and retain their trust
- respect all other people
- encourage others to act similarly

The values and lessons of the military department are central to each cadet's entire school experience, not simply the time that he spends under our direct supervision. The new Dominican formation program has provided an excellent opportunity to strengthen the relationship between the military, religious, and

academic departments. Through the combination of these three departments and on the foundation of the **four Dominican pillars**, St. Catherine's is able to educate well-rounded cadets who are prepared to become the leaders of tomorrow.

The military department has embraced the four pillars of community, ministry, study, and prayer by incorporating them into our military cadence and guidons, company games, leadership classes, formation day, and other activities.

We have also placed special focus on the pillar of community. The military tradition is especially adept in teaching students how to relate to their peers as leaders and members of a team. In addition, cadets have participated as members of the larger community through their involvement in parades, color guard activities, and special celebrations to honor our veterans and civil servants.
